As post-pandemic travel skyrocketed from people eager to get out and explore again, they began to flock to the great outdoors and more rural destinations. Travel Texas had an opportunity to get out in front of these trends and find an unconventional way to capture this demand by encouraging travelers to experience the expansive outdoors activities available within the state of Texas. Astrotourism, space travel, celestial events and dark skies were trending topics among media and travelers. Being in the direct path of the 2024 total eclipse, Texas destinations are already beginning to build buzz and sell rooms for those travel dates. In addition, stargazing content is some of Travel Texas' highest-performing social media and advertising content to date, so we knew the appetite for these niche outdoor adventures was there.

In order to position Texas as a year-round travel destination for those interested in the great outdoors and camping underneath the stars, efforts were focused on one key fly market that we had to opt out of during the pandemic: Los Angeles. We decided to provide LA with a glimpse of Texas' expansive, bright, smog-free night skies.

Whether it's stargazing at Big Bend, catching a glimpse of the Milky Way at Palo Duro Canyon or observing the night sky through a telescope at the McDonald Observatory, Travel Texas enticed these big city tourists to experience the Texas night sky in the heart of LA through an immersive starry skies room. When guests stepped inside, they watched, heard, smelled and felt what it's like to stand beneath a vast dark sky full of stars in Texas. The primary goal of this campaign was to drive meaningful consumer engagements – both in person and via owned social media channels – in a key fly market that Travel Texas had pulled back on and needed to reactivate. The campaign required a strong media angle and connection to current trends to garner attention, while also achieving our secondary goals of generating awareness of Texas night skies experiences in a highly trafficked area of LA and expanding exposure to the Travel Texas brand.





About this Event


Come to our indoor stargazing experience at Santa Monica Place and immerse yourself in the wonders of a starry Texas night. From catching a glimpse of the Milky Way at Palo Duro Canyon State Park to observing the stars through a telescope at the McDonald Observatory, Texas' night skies simply can't be beat.

The University of Texas' McDonald Observatory, located 45 minutes north of the arts community of Marfa, offers evening stargazing parties—a perfect pit stop before heading to Big Bend National Park to traverse its soaring limestone canyons. With some of the darkest skies in the country, astronomy lovers can witness showstoppers year-round: In summer the sky features the Milky Way at its brightest and the Perseid meteor shower peaking in August. The notable Hercules, Virgo, and Scorpius constellations become visible during warm summer months, while the celebrated Orion, Taurus, and Andromeda appear with the crisp, clear air of winter. Set on the outskirts of the park, the Willow House in Terlingua offers guests sweeping views of the Chioso Mountain Range and starry nights around the campfire.






